ORDINANCE RATIFYING OR ADOPTING CERTAIN UNSIGNED ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, certain ordinances (or resolutions), described hereafter, which the official minutes of the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton indicates were passed in 2016 or 2017, do not bear the signature of either the Village President, Village Clerk, or both, and do not bear any indication that said ordinances were published in the matter required by law; and

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-614-3

An Ordinance Amending the Mapleton Village Code Chapter 7, Nuisances

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that the previously adopted provisions of the Village Code are not in keeping with current trends in such violations in the Village and are less workable now than when initially drafted; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board deems it necessary and in the best interests of the Village to amend the Mapleton Village Code as provided below;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Mapleton, Peoria County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

Section 2. That the Village Code is hereby amended to add a Section 7-11, which shall read as follows:

SECTION 7-11 RADIOS, PHONOGRAPHS, AMPLIFIERS, ETC.

No person shall allow or cause to be used or operated any radio receiving unit, musical instrument, phonograph, loudspeaker, or other machine or device for the production or reproducing of sound in such a manner as to disturb the peace, quiet, and comfort of the neighboring inhabitants or at any time with louder volume than necessary for convenient hearing for the person who is in the room, vehicle, or chamber in which such machine or device is operated and who is a voluntary listener thereto. The operation of any such set, instrument, phonograph, loud speaker, machine or device between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from the building, structure, or vehicle in which it is located shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section. The operation of any such set, instrument, phonograph, loud speaker, machine or device between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 9:59 p.m. in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 200 feet from the building, structure, or vehicle in which it is located shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section. Warnings may be given by the officer on the scene, but the giving of a warning does not bar the officer from citing the person if repeated infractions are noted. The giving of a warning, prior to issuing a citation is not required. Any person violating this section may be fined up to \$750 per occurrence.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

Section 6. Should any portion of this Ordinance be held invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such portion shall not affect any of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VILLAGE CODE, CHAPTER 5, BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE I – BUILDING CODE, SECTION 5-1. – ADOPTED, TO CHANGE A PROVISION REGARDING "ILLINOIS ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE – 2012" TO READ "ILLINOIS ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE – 2015".

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton has the authority to enact such regulations as it deems are in the best interest of public health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton deems it to be in the best interests of the Village to change a provision regarding "Illinois Energy Conservation Code – 2012" to read "Illinois Energy Conservation Code – 2015";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MAPLETON, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

Section 2. The following Chapter 5, Buildings and Building Regulations, Article I - Building Code, Section 5-1. – Adopted, of the Mapleton Village Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Section 5-1. - Adopted.

"There is hereby adopted by reference that code known as the International Building Code - 2009, save such portions as are hereinafter deleted, modified or amended. There is also hereby adopted by reference that code known as the International Residential Code - 2009, save such portions as are hereinafter deleted, modified or amended. There is further hereby adopted by reference that code known as the International Property Maintenance Code - 2009, save such portions as are hereinafter deleted, modified or amended. Other applicable codes are the Illinois Energy Conservation Code - 2015; the Illinois Accessibility Code - 1997; the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design; the International Fire Code - 2009; the International Mechanical Code 2009; and the International Fuel Gas Code - 2009. IBC 2009 Section 105 (Permits) and IRC 2009 Section R105 (Permits) shall both be deleted, as the Village of Mapleton has its own language regarding the issuing of permits. Copies of such codes have been and are now on file with the zoning administrator of the village.

State law reference—Power of city to adopt by reference, 65 ILCS 5/1-3-2."

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after ten (10) days following its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-06-13-04

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE GENERAL PREVAILING RATE OF HOURLY WAGES

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq); and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Village of Mapleton investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of the County of Peoria employed in performing construction of public works for the Village of Mapleton.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Mapleton, Peoria County, Illinois, as follows:

Section One: That to the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works" (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.), as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Mapleton is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Peoria County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June 1, 2017, a copy of said determination being attached hereto as Exhibit A and by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the Village of Mapleton. The definition of any terms appearing in this Resolution, which are also used in the aforesaid Act, shall be the same as in said Act.

Section Two: That nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village of Mapleton to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

Section Three: That the Village of Mapleton shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village of Mapleton this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

Section Four: That the Village of Mapleton shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses requesting copies of any determination stating the particular

rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

Section Five: That the Village of Mapleton shall promptly file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

Section Six: That the Village of Mapleton shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Resolution and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

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Explanations

PEORIA COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates

of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day,

Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the

removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER, MARBLE FINISHER, TERRAZZO FINISHER

Assisting, helping or supporting the tile, marble and terrazzo mechanic by performing their historic and traditional work assignments required to complete the proper installation of the work covered by said crafts. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, service and maintenance of low-voltage systems which utilizes the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision, or digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment purposes for the following: TV monitoring and surveillance, background/foreground music, intercom and telephone interconnect, field programming, inventory control systems, microwave transmission, multi-media, multiplex, radio page, school, intercom and sound burglar alarms and low voltage master clock systems.

Excluded from this classification are energy management systems, life safety systems, supervisory controls and data acquisition systems not intrinsic with the above listed systems, fire alarm systems, nurse call systems and raceways exceeding fifteen feet in length.

LABORER, SKILLED - BUILDING

The skilled laborer building (BLD) classification shall encompass the

following types of work, irrespective of the site of the work: cutting & acetylene torch, gunnite nozzlemen, gunnite pump men & pots, kettlemen & carriers of men handling hot stuff, sandblaster nozzle men, sandblasting pump men & pots, setting up and using concrete burning bars, wood block setters, underpinning & shoring of existing buildings, and the unload-ing and handling of all material coated with creosote.

LABORER, SKILLED - HIGHWAY

The skilled laborer heavy & highway (HWY) classification shall encompass the following types of work, irrespective of the site of the work: jackhammer & drill operator, gunite pump & pot man, puddlers, vibrator men, wire fabric placer, sandblast pump & pot man, strike off concrete, unloading, handling & carrying of all creosoted piles, ties or timber, concrete burning bars, power wheelbarrows or buggies, asphalt raker, brickset-ters, cutting torchman (electric & acetylene), men setting lines to level forms, form setters, gunite nozzle man &

sandblasting nozzle man, power man, and rip-rapping by hand.

SURVEY WORKER - Operated survey equipment including data collectors, G.P.S. and robotic instruments, as well as conventional levels and transits.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION
Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air
compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by
separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic
helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials,
tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up
to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle

combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more.

Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site;

distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract.

The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

Class 1. Cranes; Overhead Cranes; Gradall; All Cherry Pickers;

Mechanics; Central Concrete Mixing Plant Operator; Road Pavers (27E - Dual Drum - Tri Batchers); Blacktop Plant Operators and Plant

Engineers; 3 Drum Hoist; Derricks; Hydro Cranes; Shovels; Skimmer Scoops; Koehring Scooper; Drag Lines; Backhoe; Derrick Boats; Pile Drivers and Skid Rigs; Clamshells; Locomotive Cranes; Dredge (all types) Motor Patrol; Power Blades - Dumore - Elevating and similar types; Tower Cranes (Crawler-Mobile) and Stationary; Crane-type Backfiller; Drott Yumbo and similar types considered as Cranes;

Caisson Rigs; Dozer; Tournadozer; Work Boats; Ross Carrier;

Helicopter; Tournapulls - all and similar types; Scoops (all sizes);

Pushcats; Endloaders (all types); Asphalt Surfacing Machine; Slip Form Paver; Rock Crusher; Heavy Equipment Greaser; CMI, CMI Belt Placer, Auto Grade & 3 Track and similar types; Side Booms; Multiple Unit Earth Movers; Creter Crane; Trench Machine; Pump-crete-Belt Crete-Squeeze Cretes-Screw-type Pumps and Gypsum; Bulker & Pump - Operator will clean; Formless Finishing Machine; Flaherty Spreader or similar types; Screed Man on Laydown Machine; Wheel Tractors (industrial or Farm-type w/Dozer-Hoe-Endloader or other attachments); F.W.D. & Similar Types; Vermeer Concrete Saw.

Class 2. Dinkeys; Power Launches; PH One-pass Soil Cement Machine (and similar types); Pugmill with Pump; Backfillers; Euclid Loader; Forklifts; Jeeps w/Ditching Machine or other attachments; Tuneluger; Automatic Cement and Gravel Batching Plants; Mobile Drills (Soil Testing) and similar types; Gurries and Similar Types; (1) and (2) Drum Hoists (Buck Hoist and Similar Types); Chicago Boom; Boring Machine & Pipe Jacking Machine; Hydro Boom; Dewatering System; Straw Blower; Hydro Seeder; Assistant Heavy Equipment Greaser on Spread;

Tractors (Track type) without Power Unit pulling Rollers; Rollers on Asphalt -- Brick Macadem; Concrete Breakers; Concrete Spreaders; Mule Pulling Rollers; Center Stripper; Cement Finishing Machines & CMI Texture & Reel Curing Machines; Cement Finishing Machine; Barber Green or similar loaders; Vibro Tamper (All similar types)

Self-propelled; Winch or Boom Truck; Mechanical Bull Floats; Mixers over 3 Bag to 27E; Tractor pulling Power Blade or Elevating Grader;

Porter Rex Rail; Clary Screed; Truck Type Hoptoe Oilers; Fireman;

Spray Machine on Paving; Curb Machines; Truck Crane Oilers; Oil

Distributor; Truck-Mounted Saws.

Class 3. Air Compressor; Power Subgrader; Straight Tractor; Trac Air without attachments; Herman Nelson Heater, Dravo, Warner, Silent Glo, and similar types; Roller: Five (5) Ton and under on Earth or Gravel; Form Grader; Crawler Crane & Skid Rig Oilers; Freight Elevators - permanently installed; Pump; Light Plant; Generator; Conveyor (1) or (2) - Operator will clean; Welding Machine; Mixer (3) Bag and Under (Standard Capacity with skip); Bulk Cement Plant; Oiler

on Central Concrete Mixing Plant.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

CLASS 1. Cranes; Hydro Cranes; Shovels; Crane Type Backfiller; Tower, Mobile, Crawler, & Stationary Cranes; Derricks; Hoists (3 Drum);

Draglines; Drott Yumbo & Similar Types considered as Cranes; 360

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VILLAGE CODE, CHAPTER 14, WATER SERVICE CHARGES, TO CHANGE SECTION 14-15 DISONNECTION AND SECTION 14-16 LIENNOTICE DELINQUENCY

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton has the authority to enact such regulations as it deems are in the best interest of public health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton deems it to be in the best interests of the Village to change provisions regarding Chapter 14, Water Service Charges specifically; to change Section 14-15 and Section 14-16.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MAPLETON, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein as though fully set forth.
- Section 2. The following Chapter 14, Water Service Charges of the Mapleton Village Code is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - Section 3. A. Chapter 14, Water Service Charges, Section 14-15 will read as follows:

"DISCONNECTION FOR FAILURE TO PAY: In addition to the other remedies contained in this Chapter, if the balance due for such service is not paid by the first of the month after the rendition of the bill for such services, any and all owner(s) of record for the property to which service was rendered shall receive a copy of this Section and a NOTICE OF INTENDED WATER DISCONNECTION (set forth below) via U.S. Mail.

- 1. MAKE FULL PAYMENT OF THE ABOVE CHARGES WITHIN TEN CALENDAR DAYS OF THE DATE OF NOTICE, OR;
- 2. CONTACT VILLAGE HALL, 8524 W. MAIN STREET, MAPLETON, ILLINOIS 61547, AT (309) 697-0137 OR THE WATER CHAIRMAN, AT (309) 229-8700 WITH THE OPPORTUNITY TO PRESENT YOUR SIDE OF THE CASE TO THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 14-16. UNLESS THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR CANCELS THE SHUT-OFF, THE SHUT-OFF OF YOUR WATER SERVICES MAY OCCUR ANYTIME AFTER YOUR SCHEDULED OPPORTUNITY TO PRESENT YOUR SIDE OF THE CASE.

THE WATER BILL IS DUE ON THE 20TH OF THE MONTH. A PENALTY WILL BE ADDED IF PAYMENT IS RECEIVED LATER. ACCOUNTS NOT SETTLED BY THE FIRST OF THE MONTH WILL BE DISCONNECTED ON THAT DAY. A TURN ON FEE OF \$50.00 WILL BE ADDED, IF WATER SERVICE IS DISCONNECTED. THE TOTAL DUE INCLUDING PAST DUE AMOUNT, FEES, AND PENALTIES WILL NEED TO BE PAID PRIOR TO WATER SERVICE TO BEING RESUMED. SERVICE WILL BE TURNED BACK ON AS SOON AS PRACTICALLY POSSIBLE."

B. Chapter 14, Water Service Charges, Section 14-16 will read as follows:

"The customer shall have seven (7) days from the date of such Notice to request an opportunity to present his, her or its case to the Village Administrator as to why water service should not be disconnected. After the expiration of such seven (7) day period, if no request has been made, then the Village may place a lien on the property and institute foreclosure proceedings as provided as provided under certain provisions of the Illinois Mortgage Foreclosure Law, 735 ILCS 5/15-1101 et seq., (hereinafter referred to as "IMFL") or any other applicable law as may be enacted from time to time by the Legislature of the State of Illinois. In the event the Village prevails in such mortgage foreclosure action, the owner(s) of record shall be jointly and severally liable for interest accrued on the unpaid balance in the amount of five percent (5%) per annum, and any and all costs of suit, including attorneys fees, court costs, appraisal fees, title insurance or abstract costs, broker fees and other reasonable expenses incurred in obtaining payment of the balance due."

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after ten (10) days following its passage, approval and publication as required by law.



ORDINANCE NO. 08-3 2017-0808-04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING VILLAGE CODE, CHAPTER 3, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITH PROVISIONS REGARDING VIDEO GAMING, SECTIONS 1-9.

WHEREAS, under and pursuant to the Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/1 et seq.), the Illinois General Assembly legalizes video gaming in the State of Illinois under certain terms and conditions;

WHEREAS, 65 ILCS 5/11-55.1 authorizes municipalities to regulate and control coinoperated amusement devices;

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton has the authority to enact such regulations as it deems are in the best interest of public health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Mapleton deems it to be in the best interests of the Village to allow video gaming within the Village, thereby allowing the Village to receive its portion of any State revenues distributed pursuant to taxed revenues received from the video gaming devices, and that it is the best interests of the Village to require the registration of the video gaming devices operating within the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MAPLETON, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

Section 2. The Village Code is amended to add to Chapter 3, Alcoholic Beverages the following:

Section 3. Section 3-25. – Adopted.

"No video gaming terminal licensed under the Video Gaming Act may be played except during the legal hours of operation allowed for the consumption of alcoholic beverages at the licensed establishment. Such violation is subject to termination of its license by the Board.

Each terminal operator shall maintain liability insurance on any gaming device that it places in a licensed video gaming location in an amount set by the Board.

(A) Permit Required.

(a) The operator of any video gaming terminal within the Village limits of the Village of Mapleton shall first obtain a permit for such device by the Village.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to install, keep, maintain, use or permit the installation, keeping, maintenance or use of a video gaming terminal upon his/her, or its premises unless they possess a valid permit issued by the Village of Mapleton under the terms herein.

(B) Application.

Applications for a video gaming terminal permit shall be made to the Village President in writing, signed by the applicant if an individual, or by a duly authorized agent thereof if a club, corporation or other entity duly authorized by the State of Illinois to operate video gaming machines, verified by oath or affidavit and shall contain the following information and statements:

- 1.) The name, address, age and date of birth of the owner of the video gaming terminal and of the owner of the establishment where the video gaming terminal shall be located.
- 2.) Prior convictions of the owner of the video gaming terminal and the owner of the establishment, if any.
- 3.) The place where the video gaming terminal is to be displayed or operated and the business conducted at that place.
- 4.) A description of the video gaming terminal to be covered by the permit.
- 5.) Evidence that licenses have been issued by the Illinois Gaming Board to the owner of the video gaming terminal and the owner of the establishment.

(C) Fee.

The annual fee for the permit required by this ordinance shall be an annual fee of \$25.00 per video gaming terminal or the maximum amount allowable under the Video Gaming Act at the time the annual fee is due, whichever is greater.

Permits issued pursuant to this division shall terminate on the 30th day of April next following issuance.

(D) Registration renewal.

Not less than six weeks before a registration is scheduled to expire and after a renewal notice is provided by the Village to the registrant, the registrant may submit an application for renewal provided the applicant is then qualified to receive a registration certificate.

(E) Replacement of Registration Certificate.

Whenever a registered video gaming terminal is replaced during a fiscal year, a replacement registration certificate must be purchased for \$25.00.

(F) Display.

A Village video gaming terminal permit shall be clearly displayed at all times on each video gaming terminal. A video gaming establishment license must be clearly displayed at all times.

(G) Inspection.

The Zoning Enforcing Officer shall inspect or cause the inspection of any place or building in which any such video gaming device or terminal is operated or set up for operation and to inspect, investigate and test such video gaming terminals.

(H) Revocation.

The Village President, at any time, may notify any permit holder of any charge of a violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance in connection with the operation of any video gaming terminal. After a hearing, held on 5 business days notice, presided over by the Village President, the Village President may order the revocation of permit upon a finding that the violation has occurred, and the permit shall thereupon be terminated. The permit holder may appeal the revocation to the Village Board.

(I) Eligible licenses.

The number of permits issued under this ordinance shall be limited to four (4). Each permit holder shall be entitled to operate the maximum number of terminals as authorized by the State of Illinois."
